What is offered?	<p>Our program includes training in various topics related to Tattooing for example: History, Skin Composition (allergies, scars, etc.), Products, Techniques, Machine maintenance, Client Intake & Care, AHS Regulations, Bloodborne Pathogens, Emergency First Aid, WHMIS, Fake skin practice, Live model Practice, a practicum in a real tattoo shop and so much more!</p> <p>Our Program is structured, hands-on, and above current tattoo industry standards.</p> <p>This is a certificate program eligible for Student Aid Funding.</p>	<p>Tattoo Apprenticeships typically begin by allowing the apprentice to do free labor within the tattoo shop in order to gain "experience" for a pre-determined or estimated time-frame.</p> <p>They are usually hands-off for about a year (unless discussed otherwise) before the apprentice is able to use a machine. After that it is determined by the Shop owner/mentor when and what tattoos the apprentice is allowed to take.</p> <p>Hands-on training length is determined by the mentor and can take up to a year or more to complete.</p>	<p>Blended Hairstyling, Makeup and Aesthetics, Diploma Program. They teach you: Eyelash extensions, Facials, Pedicures, Manicures, Waxing, Airbrush Makeup, Makeup Artistry 1 & 2, and UV Gel Nails.</p> <p>Mannequin Practice as well as live model practice, Hands on, structured training.</p>	<p>The Advanced Welding Technology diploma goes beyond the Alberta Welder Apprenticeship training. It combines advanced technical knowledge, welding skills, and exposure to modern technologies to give a graduate the competitive edge into a career in welding. From skills in fabrication to product innovation and inspection methods, students gain foundational skills that are in-demand by industry. This two-year program is a direct pathway into apprenticeship trades training at NAIT without having to first be a registered apprentice.</p>

Who is the mentor?	<p>We have a Professional tattoo artist with over 10 years experience in the industry operating as our Primary Instructor / Principal.</p> <p>We also have Professional tattoo artists / guest instructors that provide training in certain areas of expertise (procreate, Machine Troubleshooting, etc.).</p> <p>Other consultants that work with us include, bookkeepers, insurance brokers, art instructors, social media marketers, AHS representatives, Photographers, etc.</p>	Apprentices typically get one Artist mentor, years of experience vary, depending on the artist that accepts taking an apprentice.
